



Authorised mine surveyor (grade 1): Oral assessment guide

When making an application to the Surveyors Competence Advisory Committee (SCAC) for an authorised mine surveyor's (grade 1) certificate, a candidate is required to undertake an oral practical examination and be endorsed by a panel of authorised mine surveyor's (grade 1) certificate holders.

The candidate is expected to:

- demonstrate their skills and experience in relation to underground and quarry mine surveying
- demonstrate a comprehensive knowledge of the <u>Mines survey</u>: <u>Code of practice</u>
- submit and talk about a work portfolio containing a sample of projects and supporting evidence as per the authorised mine surveyor (grade 1): Portfolio guidance
- respond to examination panel questions on current mine surveying practices providing discussion and evidence to support their competency assessment
- work through and demonstrate practical knowledge for a desktop mine surveying scenario
- demonstrate they are a suitable person for authorisation by showing a professional approach to their portfolio and work practices.

Current mine survey practices - key focus points

- Surveying procedures
- Establishment of mine grids and datums
- Maintaining the digital mine plan and model within the mining lease
- Infrastructure and services mapping
- Open pit mining through voids
- Pit wall deformation monitoring
- Office procedures and maintaining mine record books
- Equipment maintenance and calibration
- Accurate capture and currency of excavations underground and surface mines
- Underground development plans and memos
- Stock ~ end-of-month reporting
- Appropriate use of measurement technologies.

Examination panel

The examination panel will consist of a minimum of two people, one SCAC member and other Authorised Mine Surveyors who have been endorsed by the SCAC. The oral practical examination will take approximately 90 minutes.

Location

The oral practical examination will be undertaken at the Department of Energy, Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety office in East Perth.

This is an in-person examination only.
